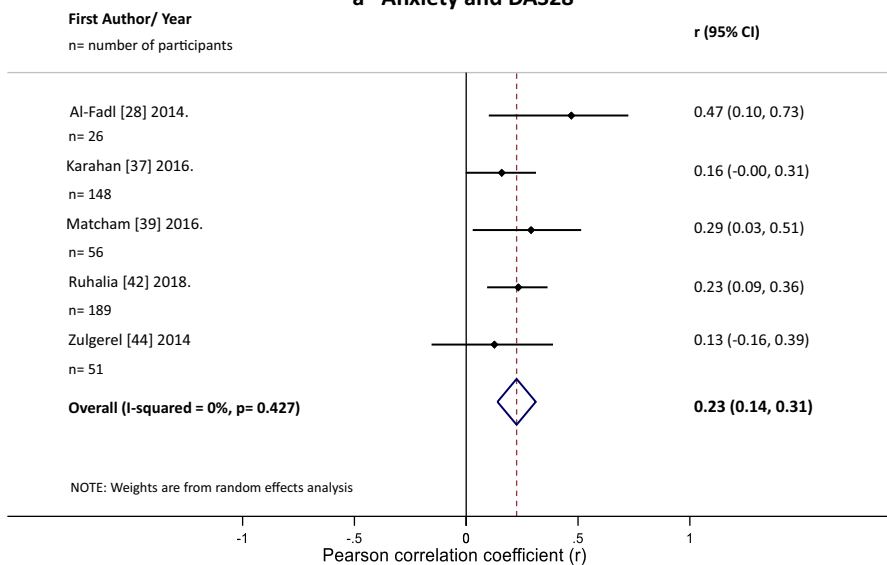

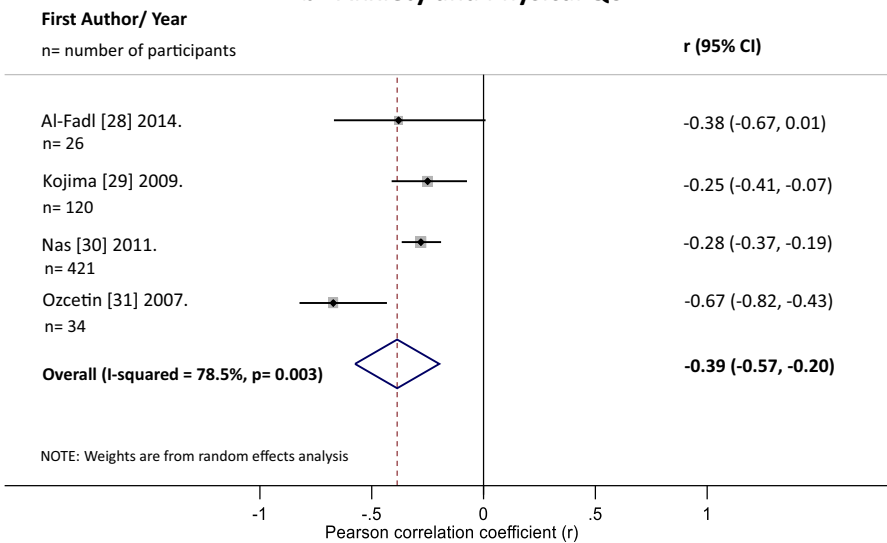

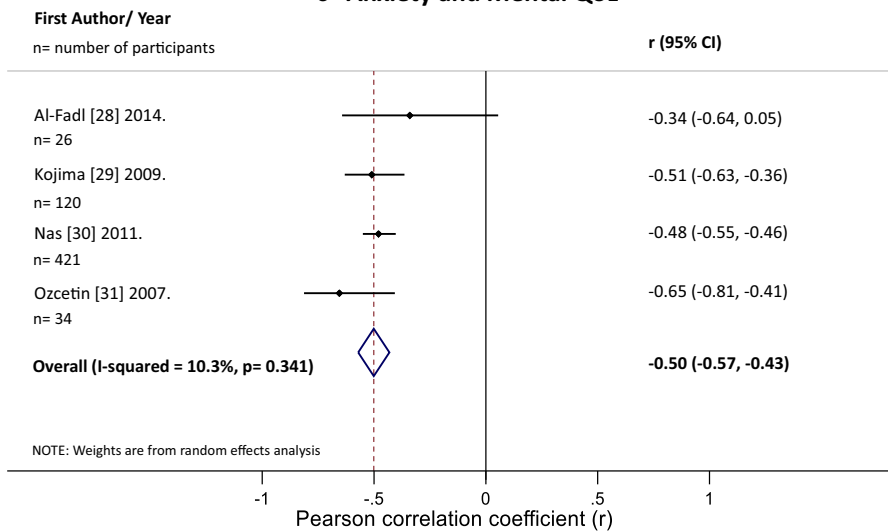
a Anxiety and DAS28
